Good afternoon James,

Thank you for your questions. I should point out that NM State Parks is proposing to amend our fees, NM Department of Game and Fish simply shared our information at our request. There is no proposed fee to launch a registered boat. The launch fee proposed applies to paddle craft, which are not registered. Regarding your question on annual passes for launching boats, I assume you are talking about our annual day use pass. We are proposing eliminating the annual day use pass, but also making day use access free to New Mexico residents. This would result in NM Residents having free access to parks for day use and you would therefore not need to purchase an annual day use pass.
